US Hispanic Leadership Institute (USHLI)-Dr.Juan Andrade Scholarship for Young Hispanic Leaders

The \$1,000 scholarship is presented at the USHLI national conference held annually in Chicago. To qualify, applicants must be enrolled or accepted for enrollment as a full-time student in a four-year institution in the U.S. or U.S. territories, and demonstrate a verifiable need for financial support. At least one parent must be of Hispanic ancestry. Recipients must be able to attend the USHLI national conference. The number of scholarships awarded varies from year to year.

Oregon Teacher Loan Forgiveness Program

The Oregon Teacher Loan Forgiveness Program forgives loans up to \$5,000 to eligible educators. Teachers must have been employed for five years in a low-income school. Eligible forgivable loans include Federal Stafford (subsidized and unsubsidized) and any portion of the Federal Consolidation Loan; Federal Direct Stafford/ Ford Loans; and defaulted FFELP and FDLP loans.

David Family Scholarship (OCF)

Applicant must be a resident of Clackamas, Lane, Linn, Marion, Multnomah, Washington, or Yamhill County, OR. First preference is to applicants entering graduate or upper-division undergraduate programs. Second preference is to applicants who are graduates of the West Linn-Wilsonville, Lake Oswego, Portland, Tigard-Tualatin, or Beaverton school districts. GPA between 2.5 and 3.5 is recommended.

Friends of Oregon Students Scholarship

Applicant must be an Oregon resident and a nontraditional student who is working and plans to continue working a minimum 20 hours per week while studying a minimum of three-quarters of full-time. Applicant must have volunteer or work experience in chosen field, be a graduate of a public alternative Oregon high school, be a GED recipient, be transferring from an Oregon community college to a four-year college, or have a minimum 2.5 GPA.

Nettie Hanselman Jaynes Scholarship (OCF)

Jose D. Garcia Migrant Education Program Scholarship

Applicant must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, be enrolled in the Oregon Migrant Education Program, and demonstrate financial need.

Oregon Education Association Scholarship

Open to seniors graduating from high schools in Oregon who plan to become teachers. Applicants must be planning to complete a baccalaureate degree and teaching certificate requirements at a college or university in Oregon.

Oregon Scholarship Fund Graduate Student Award (OCF)

Oregon residents in graduate programs in education, social work, environmental, or public service areas Oregon colleges only. Apply-competes for one additional year

Oregon Scholarship Fund Transfer Student Award (OCF)

Oregon residents currently enrolled in their second year at a community college and planning to transfer to a 4-year college in the fall of 2004

Oregon colleges only

Prior recipients may apply-competes for one additional year

Portland Public School Board Scholarship (OCF)

Graduating seniors of public high schools in Portland School District 1J. Must intend to enter teaching careers, one-time award

Portland Women's Club Scholarship

Graduates of Oregon high schools, 3.00+ cumulative high school GPA, preference to females. Automatically renewable if renewal criteria met.

South Salem High School--Merritt and Aileen Truax Scholarship (OCF)

Graduating seniors of South Salem High School. Prior recipients may apply-compete annually

Walter and Marie Schmidt Scholarship (USB)

Students enrolling in programs to become registered nurses and intending to pursue careers in geriatric health care. Preference: Students from Lane County. Additional essay: Describe desire to pursue nursing career in geriatric health care. Must enroll at least half-time. Apply-compete annually. U.S. Bancorp employees, their children, or near relatives are not eligible

Mary E. Horstkotte Scholarship Fund

For academically talented and financially needy students, for use in the pursuit of a post-secondary education.
