The Department of History at Western Oregon University (WOU) invites applications for a non-tenure-track, Visiting Assistant Professor of Latin American History/ Latin@/Chican@ Studies, and North American Studies. All eras of specialization will be considered; candidates whose work includes Public History or Environmental Studies are particularly encouraged to apply. The successful candidate will teach the U.S. History survey sequence, including a bilingual section in twentieth-century US History instructed in Spanish. The position also requires the instruction of upper-division chronological courses in Mexican, Caribbean, and Latin & South American History, and/or Latin@/Chican@ Studies. Candidates will also have opportunity to develop upper-level course(s) in their own specialization. The visiting faculty will also mentor senior History majors who are completing their senior thesis in these fields. This position supports a variety of interdisciplinary majors, minors, and programs across campus including International Studies, Latin American Studies, Latin@/Chican@ Studies, and the Bilingual Teacher Scholar program.
