Oregon Army National Guard Benefits (Optional Program)

The Adjutant General (TAG) of Oregon will not mobilize students in Army ROTC-- Policy #225.

- Basic training may be used in lieu of 1st & 2nd years of Military Science as a prerequisite for entry into MS III class.
- Joining the Oregon Army National Guard gives in state residency to out of state students.
- Upon contracting in the NG you are eligible for Federal Tuition Assistance \$4,500 per year, \$1,500 each term.
- Upon completion of basic training and specialty training cadets are eligible for:
 - CH 1606 G.I. Bill plus kicker each month of school.
 - E-5 pay for unit drill and annual training once you contract with Army ROTC.

US Army Reserves (USAR)

- Basic training may be used in lieu of 1st & 2nd years of Military Science as a prerequisite for entry into MS III class
- Upon contracting in the USAR, you are eligible for Federal Tuition Assistance \$4,500 per year, \$1,500 each term
- E-5 pay for unit drill and annual training once you contract with Army ROTC.

Simultaneous Membership Program (SMP) (for Cadets in the National Guard / Army Reserve)

Once you are contracted in either the Army National Guard or Army Reserves & Army ROTC you must join the Simultaneous Membership Program (SMP). You will become an officer in training at your National Guard / Army Reserve unit. You have the option to request commissioning into the Active Army, US Army Reserves or the Army National Guard.

Critical Language Incentive Program (CLIP)

All contracted cadets are eligible to participate in this program. Taking courses in certain critical languages pays from \$100 - \$250 monthly depending on course level.

Contracting with Army ROTC to Become an Officer

All scholarship cadets are contracted with Army ROTC to become Army Officers upon graduation. Non scholarship cadets, National Guard cadets, and USAR cadets may contract with Army ROTC as early as their MS II year. All MS III students must be contracted. All contracted cadets receive a stipend.

Service Obligation. All ROTC cadets who receive a commission incur a commitment to serve as an Army Officer:

Non-scholarship: 3 years active duty (5 years inactive)

Scholarship: 4 years active duty (4 years inactive)

National Guard or Army Reserves: 6 years in a National Guard/Army Reserve unit (2 years inactive)

NOTE: All service obligations total 8 years unless the cadet adds years for other programs (Masters Degree, Stationing, Branch, or Student loan repayment).
