

Outdoor Sculptures on Campus



Jonathan Bonner "Twin Cones"

Installed in: October 1989

Location: The Heritage Hall dormitory on the west side of building's main entrance.

Many of his works are influenced by his interest in biology and weather vanes which are visible through his designs in images such as fish, protozoa and a dinosaur's scales and teeth. "Twin Cones" sculpture in front of Heritage dormitory is described as being a 13 ½ foot high pink granite column, tapering at its summit, then topped by a 4 ½ foot-high copper sculpture resembling an arch with a horn. The copper has a patina finish, created by a salt treatment. This copper sculpture is attached to a ball bearing which turns 360 degrees with the wind, showing more of Bonner's interest in weather vanes.
