

Finding Related Articles Using Google Scholar

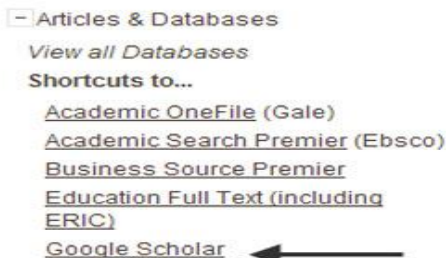
Step 1: Go to the Hamersly Library Website

Step 2: Click on Articles and Databases under FIND INFORMATION



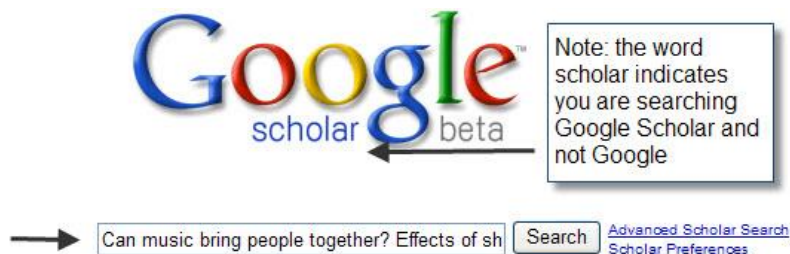
Step 3: Select Google Scholar from the List.

You can also go to www.google.com and select Google Scholar from the more drop down menu (at the top of the screen). It is important that you are in Google Scholar and not regular Google. Google Scholar only has academic journals and books listed. The advantage of going through the library is that we list journals/articles that the library has in addition to what Google Scholar provides.



Step 4: Type in the title of the journal article and click search

Example: Can music bring people together? Effects of shared musical preference on intergroup bias in adolescence.



Step 6: Click on Cited By

Cited by lists other articles that have used this article in their research.

Example: This article has been cited by 17 other articles.
