Intermediate Algebra (MTH 095) is a developmental math course designed to prepare you for MTH 111 or the MTH 211-212-213 series. If your degree requires you to take MTH 105, you do not need MTH 095 (please see your instructor/advisor for details). Credits earned by completing MTH 095 apply to enrollment (eligibility), but do not apply toward a degree and satisfy no university or college requirement. The grade received in this course will not count toward your overall GPA, but will appear on your transcript. You must earn a C- or better to meet prerequisites for MTH 111 or 211. To take MTH 095, you must have scored appropriately on the placement test or have earned a C- or better in MTH 070.

Homework is worth 10% of your final grade. It is vital to your success in this course. A significant amount of what you gain from this course will be learned through homework assignments. For retention purposes, the instructor recommends that students complete homework assignments as soon after the end of each class as possible. It is your responsibility to learn how to solve each homework problem. If you need help, go to the instructor's office hours or ask in class as soon as possible. The instructor reserves the right to administer quizzes based on homework without prior notice. MyMathLab homework assignments for each section are due at the beginning of the next class, and count toward your final grade. Please see the MyMathLab Homework section at the end of this syllabus for additional instructions.

Attendance will help you learn and is also important to your success in this course. If you miss class, it is your responsibility to get missed assignments and papers from the instructor and/or other responsible classmates.

Tests and the final exam are worth a total of 75% of your final grade, at 25% each. Tests 1 and 2 will occur during normal class time.

Skills Test is an additional test you **MUST** pass in order to pass the class. Passing the skills test does not automatically result in passing the course, but failing the skills test does result in failing the class. The first test will be during class on the below date. If you do not pass the first time, you must retake it in the Math Department office.

Quizzes and activities are worth a total of 15% of your final grade. Approximately quizzes will be administered, usually on Mondays. Quizzes are primarily based on homework assignments from the previous week. No make-up quizzes are permitted for any reason. Because of this, the lowest quiz grade will not count toward your final grade.

TI-83 or TI-84 graphing calculator is required for this course. Calculators and some computer software are important tools in mathematics, and you should learn how to use them. However, technology must not be used as replacement of mathematical understanding. For portions of some tests/quizzes calculators may be prohibited or required. Other kinds of graphing calculators are acceptable for this course; however you are responsible for learning how to use them.
