PROGRAM INFORMATION:

The Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) program at the University of Portland is a transfer program with students finishing a minimum of two years of pre-requisites (90 credit hours) before entering into the program. Students will then spend 2 years in the program to finish up their BSN. Over the last several years, approximately 500 students have annually applied for the program with approximately 50 – 70 transferring students accepted each year. The recent average GPA of students entering into the program has been ~ 3.5 on a 4.0 GPA scale. Once accepted into the program, students either begin in the fall or spring of the following academic year depending on space availability. The cost of tuition for attending the nursing program at the University of Portland is approximately \$30,000 per year. The UP nursing program has a partnership with Providence Health Systems (PHS) where students accepted into the nursing program may apply for a Providence Scholarship – please see the UP website for further details.
